## PROCEDURE FOR SERIOUS ACCIDENT, EMERGENCY OR FATALITY

This procedure is to be followed in instances of **extreme** emergency, such as:

a vehicular accident with serious injuries; a missing person (one who isn't found within a reasonable length of time); a serious injury or illness at a Girl Scout event; property <u>severely</u> damaged (by fire, for example); fatality

- 1. <u>Check</u> scene. <u>Call</u> 9-1-1. <u>Care</u> for injured.
- 2. Assign an adult to stay with injured and another adult to stay with those who are not injured. Uninjured should be removed from the scene of the accident.
- 3. Keep a responsible adult at the scene of the accident. The victim or surroundings are not to be disturbed until the police indicate to do so. Get names, addresses and phone numbers of all witnesses.
- 4. Use the following list to contact the management staff <u>in your area</u> as soon as possible: (Council will pay for toll calls.)
