Ready to go ALL IN? Order all your monthly patches at once! The All-In order is \$30 and is due **October 15**. Patches will still be mailed out on a monthly basis but this option allows you to order all patches up front at the beginning of the year.

Patch orders are due the 15th of the following month. For example, October's patch registration is due November 15th. Each patch is custom designed and will be mailed out roughly 8-10 weeks after the order is due. Individual patches are \$3 each.

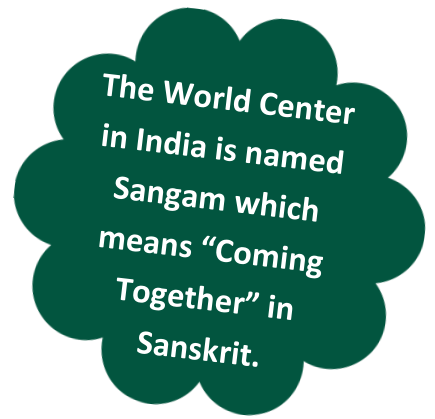

- Look up flights, train rides, or the cost of a rental vehicle from your current location to your destination. Also look up the cost of gas along the way or at your destination. See if there are any parking fees as well.
- Look up hotels, resorts, and vacation homes during the time you would like to go to get an estimated cost.
- Look up local restaurants that sound appetizing. Most places have menus online nowadays so you can see about how much things cost before you go.
- What is there to do and around how much does it cost?
- Do you want to take mementoes home with you? How much are you willing to spend?
- What do you need in case of an emergency? Enough for an emergency flight home? Or just enough to have extra for more gas just in case?
